Note Taking in Workshops

Creating new albums in the Photos app

- Write the topic or instruction on the far left of paper
 - Indent below first line when writing the first step
 - Indent again if you need to click on something
 - Keep indenting if there are a series of clicks
 - If there is another major step
 - Do the same indent pattern for each time you have to click on something
 - This approach to notes helps you know when you have followed all the steps
- When the major topic (slide) changes you again write on the far left

1. Open **Photos** on your iPhone or iPad.
2. Tap on the **Albums** tab.
3. Tap the **+** button in the upper-left corner.
4. Tap **New Album**.
5. Name the **album** and tap on **Save**.
6. Tap **photos** that you want to add to the album.
7. Tap **Done**.

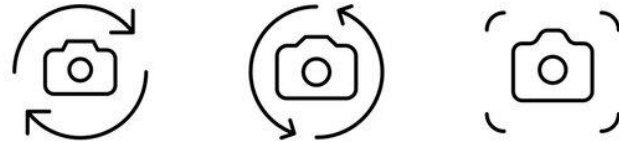

Taking Photos

- Traditional picture taking – point and click

- Selfies – Look on camera screen for

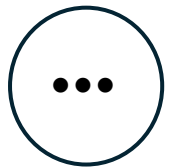


- As mirror – Use selfie to check hair



- As viewer – Use camera to “peek” over things you can’t see behind

- Scanning documents – use Files app, click Scan Documents



Organizing Photos

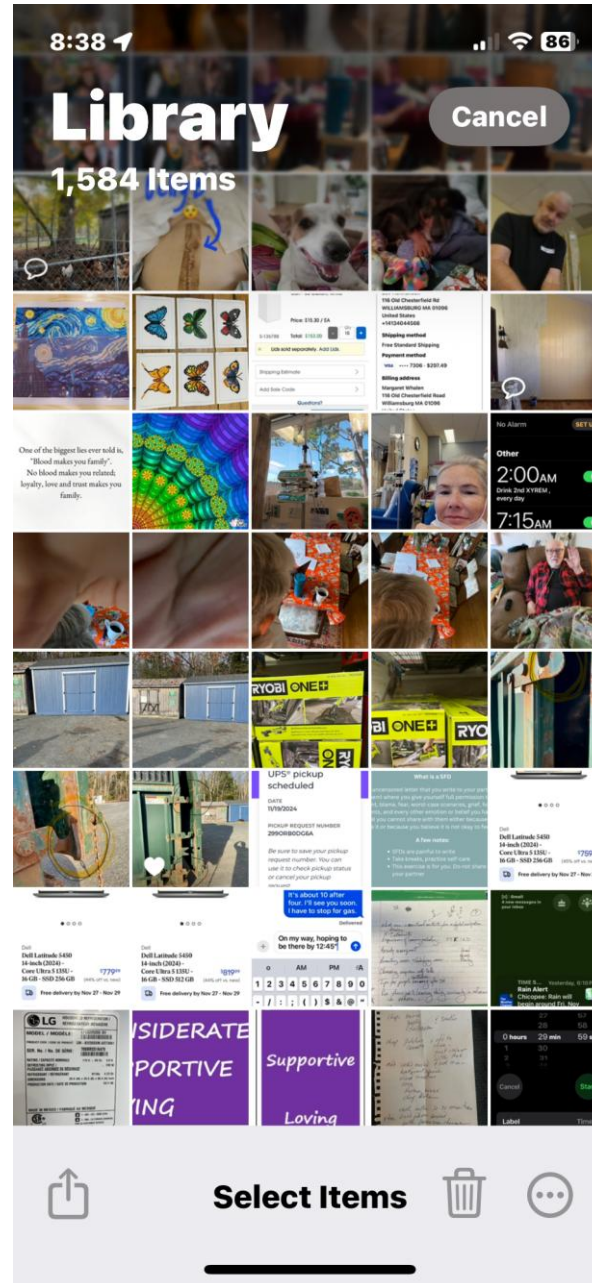
Library –

Collection of photos you've taken that stay in order taken

Albums –

Ways to organize photos by “assigning” them to grouping

PHOTO LIBRARY / GALLERY



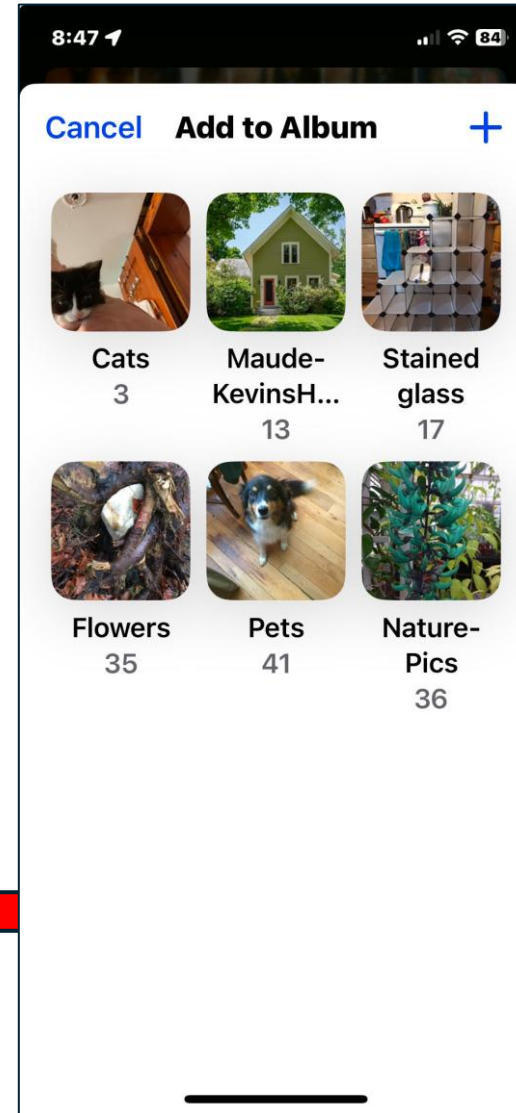
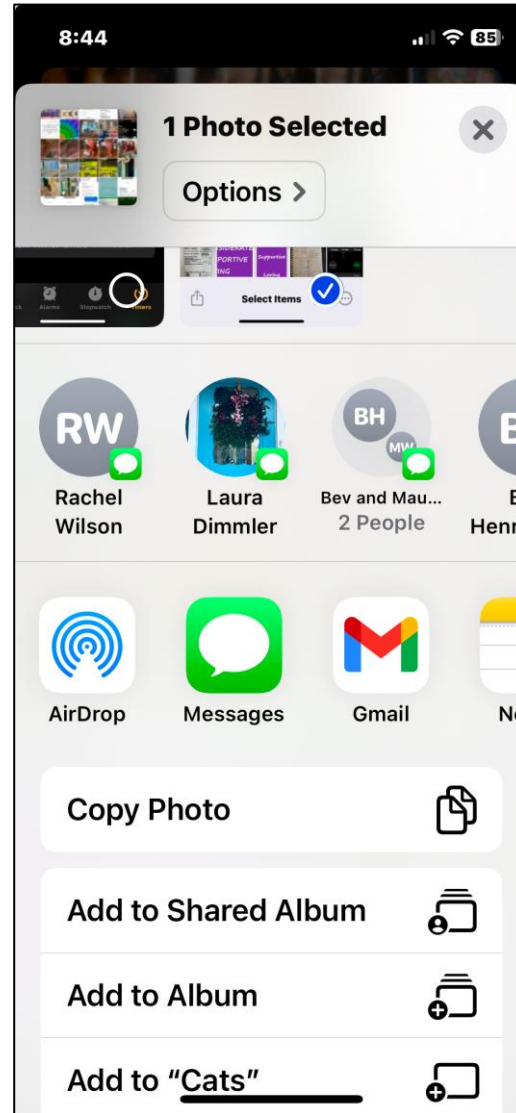
Tap on a photo and a marker appears, tap multiple pictures and they also will be “selected”

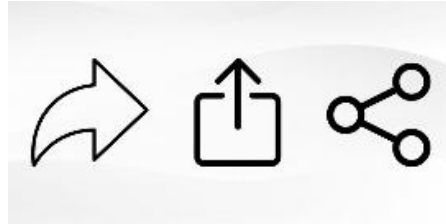

- Share/Send icons

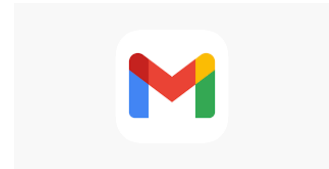

Then look for the SHARE icon and tap/click

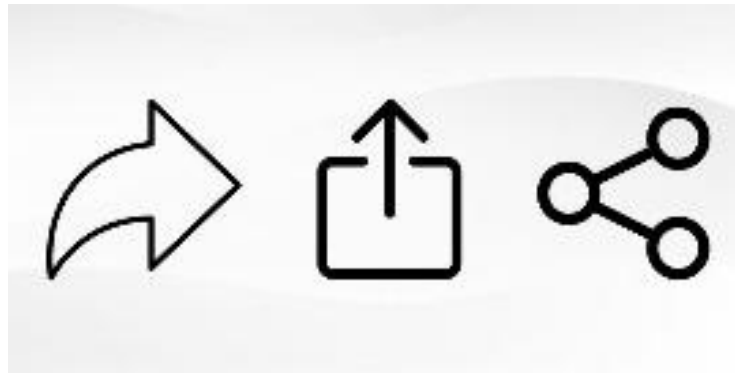
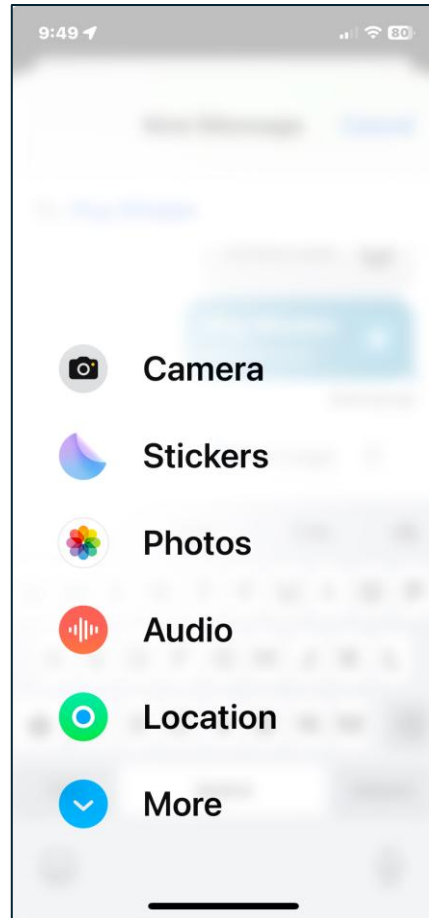

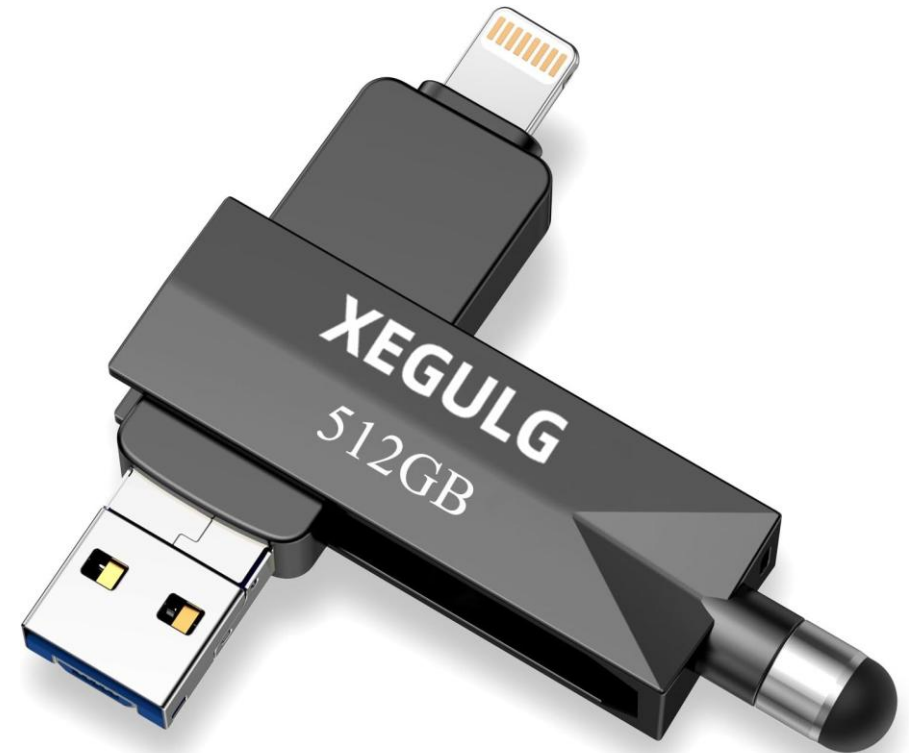

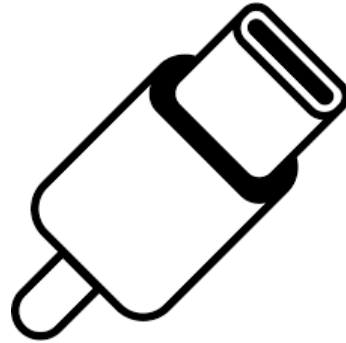

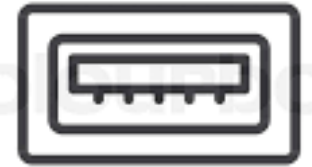
